- ATM & credit cards
- Checkbook
- Multiple currency
- Safe deposit keys
- Government Travel Card

2. Medical Items

- Medical and dental records
- Immunization cards
- Glasses & contacts
- Prescriptions
- Medications

3. Personal belongings

- Clothing
- Toys and games
- Pet items
- Cell phone
- Chargers for all electronics



4. Food and water

- Snacks
- Water

5. Documentation

- Passport(s) & Visas
- State Department ID
- Marriage, birth, adoption and naturalization certificates
- Driver's license
- Auto insurance policies, registrations and title if applicable
- Power of attorney & will
- School records
- Pet records
- Household effects inventory

Post Evacuation – Your Documents

Make sure you create, purchase, or apply for certain documents now:

- Will or will/trust combination
- Durable power of attorney
- Bank powers of attorney
- Medical power of attorney
- Medical insurance
- Property insurance (check coverage!!!)
- Life Insurance
- US driver's license
- Over 55? Consider long-term care insurance

Keep certain original documents in a U.S. safe-deposit box:*

- Stock and bond certificates
- Birth certificates
- Naturalization papers
- Adoption papers
- Marriage certificates
- Deeds to property

*Don't forget to make certified copies of originals!

Keep certain documents with you at all times:

- Passports*
- Insurance policies
- Medical, dental and shot records (including copies of clearances)*
- Prescriptions*
- Employment records (latest resumes, evaluation and SF-50s)*
- Safe deposit box keys*
- Household Inventory*
- School records*
- Powers of attorney (medical, durable and bank)*
- Wills and trust documents*
- Bank records (most recent year)
- Stock records (records of purchases)
- Certified copies of birth certificates
- Passwords for internet accounts*
- Tax records (last three years)
- Address database or book*
- Car title (in the States you would keep this in your safe deposit box, but overseas you usually need it to register the car at post)

*Hard to replace items that should be kept in a fire-proof safe
